ASH WEDNESDAY

READINGS

Joel 2:12-19; Psalm 51:1-17; 2 Cor. 5:20b—6:10; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. - Ps. 51:1 (ESV)

Open the eyes of my heart, Lord, to listen to where You want me to serve. Give me Your eyes to see the needs that I am best qualified to meet. Fill me with Your Spirit to see Your children as You do, with generosity and compassion. Forgive me for my selfish ways and turn me towards Your purpose for me. You are my magnificent Savior. I love You and want my life to reflect Your glory.

Please lay on our hearts, each individual, ways we are being called to use our time, talent, and treasure. Make us eager to follow your leading in these matters. Please bless Faith Lutheran beyond our wildest imaginations.

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 25:1-10; Daniel 9:1-14; 1 John 1:3-10

"Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths." - Psalm 25:4

Lord, let me be an instrument / servant for You. I pray in Your holy name, Lord. May my family be unified in Your name. I pray fervently; make me a prayer warrior.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

... That God will use me, show me how He wants me to be involved in this initiative. That the Holy Spirit will light a fire in us, so that we invite others in, that we share the love of Christ and that we glorify God through this process.

... That Faith will be a place where ALL feel welcome. Where families grow and find others to do life with. I pray that our church will grow both within and outside its walls, to be the light our city, country and world so desperately needs. I pray that Faith Lutheran will remain a place where we feel at home.

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 25:1-10; Daniel 9:15-25a; 2 Timothy 4:1-5

"Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long." -Psalm 25:5

Heavenly Father, thank You for bringing us together for a time of planning, of vision, and fellowship. Lord, I pray that as we enter into conversations with You in the coming months, that You give us receptive hearts, and ears to listen to Your will. As You have led the trailblazers of our church 70 years ago, we pray that the trailblazing work that we are doing today will have great impact on Your kingdom on earth from today forward. READINGS

Psalm 25:1-10; Psalm 32; Matthew 9:2-13

"Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of your goodness, O Lord!" - Psalm 25:7

Heavenly Father, bless us with the presence of Your Holy Spirit. Convict, convert and consecrate us as we strive to be All In on the Jesus-shaped path. In Jesus' name. Amen.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

... That 1) prayer would be abundant throughout this initiative; 2) prayer will be in our hearts and minds; 3) prayer will be for our church and for our members. That God's awesome power will be recognized in answer to all these prayers – and our church will see both abundant giving and abundant population growth – and that people's lives will be changed and strengthened via connections made at Faith.

SERMON READINGS

Isaiah 55:1-5 Mark 6:30-43

Isaiah 55:1-5 (NRSV)

Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat!
Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.
Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread.

and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food.

Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live.

I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David.

See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples.

See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel,

for he has glorified you.

FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

Mark 6:30-43 (NRSV)

The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat.

And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

When it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late; send them away so that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy something for themselves to eat.' But he answered them, 'You give them something to eat.' They said to him, 'Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread, and give it to them to eat?' And he said to them, 'How many loaves have you? Go and see.' When they had found out, they said, 'Five, and two fish.' Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass.

So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and he divided the two fish among them all. And all ate and were filled; and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 77; Job 4:1-21; Ephesians 2:1-10

"In the day of my trouble I seek the Lord; in the night my hand is stretched out without wearying; my soul refuses to be comforted." - Psalm 77:2

Lord, we ask that You lead us; guide our hearts and minds to do Your will. Help us take care of Your people here and keep our eyes and focus on You. All in Christ Jesus we pray, Amen.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 20, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 77; Job 5:8-27; 1 Peter 3:8-18a

"'Has God forgotten to be gracious? Has he in anger shut up his compassion?' Selah" - Psalm 77:9

Heavenly Father, we ask Your guidance as we begin the All In walk. We know You have a vision for us. I pray for Your guidance as we begin our new tithing, and help us discern new ways we can share our time and talent.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

- ... For hearts to be softened, souls to be enriched, minds to be opened, hands to be busy and community to be built stronger.
- ... That Your Holy Spirit will enable, empower and equip us to boldly share Your plan(s) of salvation and for Faith Lutheran Church. That we might find favor and be a pleasing aroma to attract all we come in contact with for Your glory. For new opportunities, to be bold, and for success.
- ... For better understanding of God and each other and that we all feel comfortable at Faith and grow in faith.
- ... For us to find more person-to-person connections to go through life together.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 21, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 77; Proverbs 30:1-9; Matthew 4:1-11

"Then I said, 'I will appeal to this, to the years of the right hand of the Most High.'" - Psalm 77:10

Dear Lord, guide us with Your wisdom as we move forward. Help us to meet people where they are, find our commonalities and listen to their concerns and reservations. Help us to share our faith with others with confidence, but humbly, with hope, love and perseverance – and our family at Faith will grow. In the Name of Jesus, Amen.

READINGS

Psalm 22:23-31; Genesis 15:1-6, 12-18; Romans 3:21-31

"For he has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted, and he has not hidden his face from him, but has heard, when he cried to him." - Psalm 22:24

Oh Lord, "Comfort, comfort, oh My people." But sometimes we get too comfortable, Oh Lord. Tickle our consciousness, stir up within us a sense of our own need, a sense of empty places, our rotting cores – and then guide us to move forward. To fill those spaces with Your will and Your word. Heal us so we may follow You more fully, more faithfully.

- ... To find a way to bring the message of love shown by Jesus to a suffering and mistrustful world. Help us show how loving one another is necessary for peace in the world
- ... For a local outreach to people in the Albuquerque area who are hurting and needing the peace and truth of the gospel.
- ... That 1) we would be open to unconventional ideas; 2) we continue to learn the names of and about fellow worshipers, growing the sense of community here; 3) FLC would help many, many people find Christ; 4) FLC would be fully funded and debt free, and 5) people suffering alone in Albuquerque can find peace and solace here at FLC.

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FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 22:23-31; Genesis 16:1-6; Romans 4:1-12

"The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord! May your hearts live forever!" - Psalm 22:26

Take me, Lord, and use me for Your good. Take doubt and self-centeredness away from me. Give our leaders wisdom and discernment; don't let them be discouraged. Take me out of my comfort zone. Give me courage to speak and witness what I know to be true. Thank You for being with us every step forward.

- ... That we would 1) spread the gospel of Christ to those who do not know the Lord; 2) support overseas missions; 3) improve local outreach; and 4) make prudent financial decisions.
- ... That All In means each of us takes part, in whatever stage of life we are.
- ... That we would all grow stronger in God!
- ... For a generous heart financially and works we can contribute to the function of the church.

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SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 22:23-31; Genesis 16:7-15; Mark 8:27-30

"All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations shall worship before you." - Psalm 22:27

I pray that this initiative leads to ways to bring people to Jesus that didn't know Him - ways that can bring people into the building and start their journey to a lasting relationship with Jesus.

Bless us, O God; move in our hearts to be All In and to increase in our mission involvement both locally and internationally.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

... That God's Spirit will move mightily within FLC to draw His people into a closer relationship with Him and experience His love and blessings on another level as we walk in obedience to all of His word. That through His people at FLC He would turn the hearts of the lost and give them the truth that will set them free from the lies of the world. That all we do be for His glory and His kingdom.

... For 1) increased engagement (discipleship, time, talent, resources); 2) mission outreach (local and global); and 3) being a resource for our community.

READINGS

Psalm 22:23-31

"All the prosperous of the earth eat and worship; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, even the one who could not keep himself alive." - Psalm 22:29

SERMON READING

Mark 7:14-30

Mark 7:14-30 (ESV)

And he called the people to him again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand: There is nothing outside a person that by going into him can defile him, but the things that come out of a person are what defile him." And when he had entered the house and left the people. his disciples asked him about the parable. And he said to them, "Then are you also without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him, since it enters not his heart but his stomach, and is expelled?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.) And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. All these evil things come from within. and they defile a person."

And from there he arose and went away to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And he entered a house and did not want anyone to know, yet he could not be hidden. But immediately a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit heard of him and came and fell down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, a Syrophoenician by birth. And she begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. And he said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." But she answered him, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." And he said to her, "For this statement you may go your way; the demon has left your daughter." And she went home and found the child lying in bed and the demon gone.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 26, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 105:1-11, 37-45; Genesis 21:1-7; Hebrews 1:8-12

"Oh give thanks to the Lord; call upon his name; make known his deeds among the peoples!" - Psalm 105:1

Thank You, Lord, for our pastors. Continue to inspire them with Your Holy Spirit. Thank You for our LCMC congregation and its unity in purpose and love for Jesus Christ. Thank You, Lord, for our country and freedom to worship You. Guide and protect our country from the evil one.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

- ... For the health and vitality of our pastors as they lead this initiative.
- ... That I would 1) ask God to reveal to me how to fully trust Him; 2) begin with myself to be All In; 3) "Just do it."; 4) help others to do the same.
- ... That we would be unified in supporting and sharing in the All In vision - longtime and newer members, across the age spectrum.
- ... For 1) my ability to increase my donations; 2) my ability to spend more time helping at church; 3) us to figure out ways to reach out to young couples to try Faith; and 4) us to figure out how to increase our draw to Faith.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 105:1-11, 37-45; Genesis 22:1-19; Hebrews 11:1-3, 13-19

"He remembers his covenant forever, the word that he commanded, for a thousand generations" - Psalm 105:8

Lord God, we pray that You will help and guide us with this All In process. Bring in our old members and help us find new families to bring Your word to. Give us the knowledge and words to be successful in the endeavor. Amen.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

... That all giving, whether time, talents or treasure, springs from a willingness to trust God that He will not let us fall. In our time, that it wouldn't be wasted; in our treasure, that it would not be squandered or cause us to default; and with our talents, that they would not be scorned, marginalized, unappreciated, or, worse yet, give the wrong message. That takes trust that God will take what we give, fulfill our needs, and increase our giving the yield of it, anyway. We need to trust God and understand He is always trustworthy.

... That we would help engage others spiritually; for example with new classes, more small group gatherings, with people praying for others, and sharing our stories with each other - trusting God to provide for all our needs.

... That we would be inclusive with newcomers and oldcomers - recognize and communicate with all in a variety of ways.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 28, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 105:1-11, 37-45; Jeremiah 30:12-22; John 12:36-43

"So he brought his people out with joy, his chosen ones with singing." - Psalm 105:43

Dear Lord, we give you thanks for this church and the staff. Bless us with Your Holy Spirit, with strength and ideas to bring all members back in Your grace. Call the hearts of those who are absent and bring them back to us. We pray for Your guidance. In Your Name, Amen.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

... That we would follow the teachings of Jesus to spread His Word and support His church in the world.

... For 1) more people to come to know Christ and His love for them; 2) Faith Lutheran to come together in unity as the body of Christ; 3) those who don't know their place or purpose in the body of Christ to come to understand where they fit or belong in the body of Christ and to grow in their purpose and belonging; and 4) this initiative to have the love of Christ at its front and center.

... That we 1) develop talents for discipleship throughout the church; 2) use our talents to serve people inside and outside the church; and 3) be fully in tune with the Holy Spirit's leading, guided by God's wisdom.

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THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 29, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 19; Exodus 19:1-9a; 1 Peter 2:4-10

"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork." - Psalm 19:1

Heavenly Father, turn our hearts to be obedient to Your will. Help us to grow in all ways to make our lives reflective of Jesus' life and love.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

... That 1) we might be Spirit-filled and Spirit-led; and 2) when we think / reflect on Faith Lutheran, we all might consider it an important community - that fellow members are "our people" in this world.

... For 1) peace and healing; 2) understanding of truth from fiction; and 3) understanding of others' points of view.

... That I personally, and we as a congregation, will be committed to discipleship. To not only invite others, but to ensure they grow and remain in the body of Christ - "Fruit that Remains." That we allow Jesus to shift the shape of this mission to how He wants it to look. Allow Him to define success, even if we do not reach our originally stated goals.

... For 1) success for the initiative to bring more people to know Jesus (growth); 2) the church to remain strong, unified and healthy - filled with love, peace and harmony; and 3) hearts and minds to be infused with the Holy Spirit in all we say and do.

FRIDAY, MARCH 1, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 19; Exodus 19:9b-15; Acts 7:30-40

"...the precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes..." - Psalm 19:8

My prayer is that each of us would reflect sincerely, and be willing to be honest with ourselves about our sacrificial giving. I pray that the Lord will provide opportunities for us to find others and minister to each other through this. And I pray that this will bring each of us into further worship and relationship with You, our Father. Amen.

- ... That I would be a light, an example of what All In means. I pray that the Lord shows me where to best use my time and talents to His glory while putting Him first.
- ... That we find many paths that can bring in new members.
- ... For excitement, engagement and gospel focus. That we might 1) be Spirit-filled and Spirit-led; 2) grow to be more intentional together; and 3) grow in wisdom and knowledge of our God.
- ... That those who are in need will receive what they require.

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SATURDAY, MARCH 2, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 19; Exodus 19:16-25; Mark 9:2-8

"Who can discern his errors? Declare me innocent from hidden faults." - Psalm 19:12

Is this Your will, Lord? If it is, make that clear to us. Guide us step by step, Lord, in this journey. Give us the wisdom, strength, courage and gentleness of Your call. I ask that You be with and bless Faith Lutheran Church; keep our eyes, minds, and souls on You. Thank You, God, for this opportunity. Amen.

- ... That our church will always seek to do God's will (not ours) first and foremost. I pray that God will lead us, and that we, as a church, will listen to Him. I pray that God will give us the strength, time, talent, and treasure to do His will. Please God, inspire the people in our congregation to see this as an opportunity, not a burden.
- ... That each of us would examine our own commitment.
- ... That we each find new strength and new focus and new ways to use our time, talent, and money to support the power, the people, and the potential of All In.
- ... That we would become more aware of the needs and mission of Faith and the church as a whole.

READINGS

Psalm 19

"Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer." - Psalm 19:14

SERMON READING

Mark 8:27-38

Mark 8:27-38 (ESV)

And Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. And on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" And they told him, "John the Baptist; and others say, Elijah; and others, one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Christ." And he strictly charged them to tell no one about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again. And he said this plainly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man."

And calling the crowd to him with his disciples, he said to them, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

MONDAY, MARCH 4, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 84; 1 Kings 6:1-4, 21-22; 1 Corinthians 3:10-23

"My soul longs, yes, faints for the courts of the Lord; my heart and flesh sing for joy to the living God." - Psalm 84:2

All we have is God's - a trust from Him - He sent Jesus as a sacrifice - What can I sacrifice for Him? I pray that the Holy Spirit would guide and enable each of us to see the need and to trust Him to provide. That we would each give sacrificially of our money, time and abilities to bring glory to God. Knowing that He is able to do more than we could ever ask and imagine - What He calls us to do, He enables us to do. That I would trust Him, put myself aside and seek His will - all to God's glory. Amen.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

- ... To engage and connect with those outside of our congregation who are seeking to find their identity in Christ. They may not know that they are searching for this, but I pray that by building a strong community as a church, we would boldly welcome these into the fold.
- ... That something good happens.
- ... That we all feel touched by this initiative and welcomed and invited to participate in whatever way(s) we are able.

TUESDAY, MARCH 5, 2024

READINGS

Psalm 84; 2 Chronicles 29:1-11, 16-19; Hebrews 9:23-28

"O Lord God of hosts, hear my prayer; give ear, O God of Jacob! Selah" - Psalm 84:8

Dear Lord, I thank You for this church, pastors and friends. Please bless our efforts and help us grow in Your grace. Heal this world and bring peace. May those hurting and needing comfort find You and our church. We have confidence that You are with us and hear us. We give You the glory. In Your name, Amen.

My prayer for the ALL IN Initiative is...

... That 1) we would prayerfully consider all elements of the initiative; 2) that the initiative is successful if that is the will of God; and 3) that we would see ourselves included in the initiative; and 4) that each of us is included as the initiative moves forward.

... That we think in terms of what people outside our church may need, and how we might help them find that here.

... That God would lead me to where I can serve.

All things are possible for one who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You mute and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer."

SERMON READING

Mark 14:12-26

Mark 14:12-26 (ESV)

And on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, his disciples said to him, "Where will you have us go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" And he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' And he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready; there prepare for us." And the disciples set out and went to the city and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

And when it was evening, he came with the twelve. And as they were reclining at table and eating, Jesus said, "Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me." They began to be sorrowful and to say to him one after another, "Is it I?" He said to them, "It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread into the dish with me. For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born"

And as they were eating, he took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to them, and said, "Take; this is my body." And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, and they all drank of it. And he said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly, I say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." and when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

GOOD FRIDAY

READINGS

Psalm 22

SERMON READING

Mark 15:33-41

Mark 15:33-41 (ESV)

And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" And some of the bystanders hearing it said, "Behold, he is calling Elijah." And someone ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a reed and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down." And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!"

There were also women looking on from a distance, among whom were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome. When he was in Galilee, they followed him and ministered to him, and there were also many other women who came up with him to Jerusalem.

READINGS

Lamentations 3:1-9, 19-24; Psalm 31:1-4, 15-16; 1 Peter 4:1-8; Matthew 27:57-66

"In you, O Lord, do I take refuge; let me never be put to shame; in your righteousness deliver me!" - Psalm 31:1

Heavenly Father, thank You for all that You have done for us. Everything we are, everything we have, are because of You. We know that You hear our prayers. We ask that You will help us to hear Your response and challenge to us.

Mark 16:1-8

Mark 16:1-8 (ESV)

When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back-it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. And he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.
